Program Notes



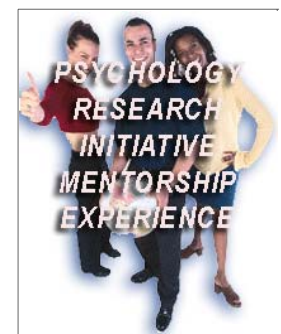
